Wrap around care update

Since September we have been looking at ways to expand our wrap around care and extracurricular offer to our children and families.

Alongside the additional after school clubs, which have proven very popular, we are also keen to provide further provision in extending the school day.

The initial proposal for this would be the following:

Breakfast Club: 7:45-8:30

After School Club: Early Half Session: 3:05-4:15pm Half Session: 4:15-5:30pm Full Session: 3:05-5:30pm

To facilitate this, we would be partnering with Premier Education, who run a number of similar provisions at local primary schools.

Prior to confirming this, we will need to gage the interest and demand of our community to ensure it is viable and tailored accordingly to the needs of our families.

School Closure due to NEU Strike Action:

Throughout the week we have considered the impact of the strikes carefully and have taken the difficult decision to <u>partially close the school to all pupils other than those of key workers</u> and vulnerable children on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July.
