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<u>E-Safety 2 Minute Read:</u> <u>Roblox</u>

As your child explores the digital world through platforms like Roblox, ensuring their online safety is paramount. Here's a concise guide for parents to navigate Roblox responsibly:

Age Verification: Roblox is designed for users aged 7 and above. Confirm your child's age aligns with this requirement, and be aware of age-appropriate content within the game.

Account Privacy: Teach your child about privacy settings on Roblox. Ensure their account is set to private, limiting interactions to friends they know offline.

In-Game Communication: Discuss the importance of responsible communication. Emphasize that they should only interact with friends and acquaintances, avoiding conversations with strangers.

Purchases and Transactions: Monitor and control in-game purchases. Set up spending limits to prevent unintended transactions and educate your child on the value of virtual currency.

Time Management: Encourage responsible screen time. Set limits on how much time your child spends on Roblox to maintain a healthy balance between online and offline activities.

Game Content Awareness: Stay informed about the games your child plays on Roblox. Familiarize yourself with the content to ensure it aligns with your family values and is suitable for their age.
