Welcome back! Wishing you all a very Happy New Year! I hope that the year has started positively for you despite the rather dreary weather! We have had a super start to 2024 here in school and are excited about all our plans for the rest of this academic year.

This week, the children have settled quickly and produced some great learning. I always enjoy seeing the excitement and intrigue as they learn about their new topics, class texts and areas of focus for the term.

I have been lucky enough to see some of this in action this week in a range of different maths lessons: Windmills have been exploring the properties of shapes and using these to create some wonderful pieces of artwork, Smugglers have been building on their knowledge of number bonds to support them when subtracting from multiples of ten, Vikings have been securing their knowledge of arrays in multiples of 4 and 6, whilst in Rother, children have been applying their understanding of multiplication to multiply fractions – it has certainly been a busy week!

It was great to see our Forest School sessions get back underway this today. During the workshops, children were developing their techniques in campfires, identifying plants and wildlife whilst also hunting for minibeasts and spiders. They had a great time despite the mud and rain.

Although it is one of our shorter school terms, we still have much to look forward to with our choir due to visit the O2 for their Young Voices performance, a range of upcoming sports events, further forest school sessions, a WSA disco and a cake sale to fit in alongside all the exciting learning and opportunities children in their classes.

Why Proper School Shoes Matter:

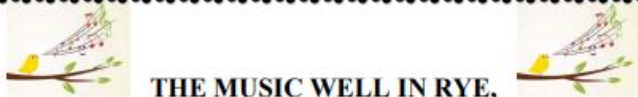
Support and Comfort: Appropriate school shoes are designed to provide the support and comfort needed for a full day of learning and activities.
