As Jesus wisely stated, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

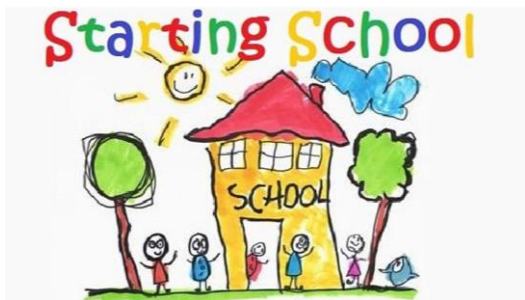
I wonder what we do if someone tries to catch us out or make us look foolish or bad? I wonder how we can try and answer calmly and wisely?

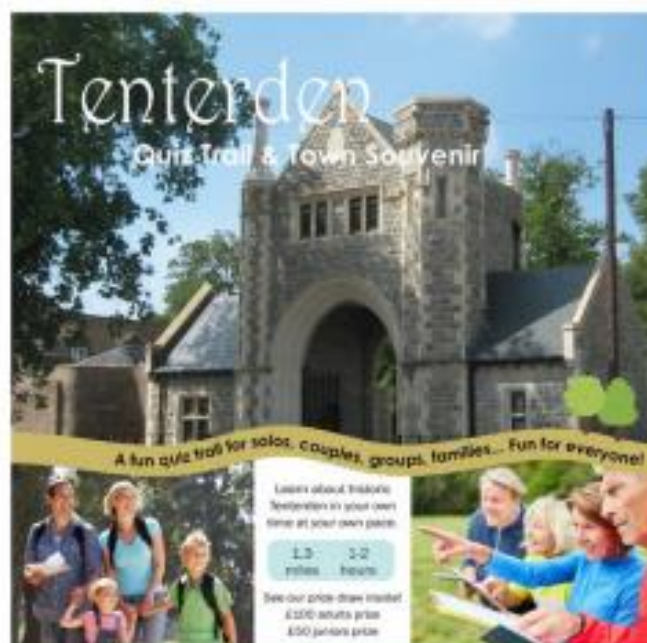

Your Trash Might Be Our Treasure!

Did you know that playtime is about 20% of every child's day at school? That's 1.4 years of every child's life while they are at primary school.

Playing outdoors in rich play environments is one of the best ways for children to develop social skills, build resilience, make more friends, be more creative and care more about the planet. Right now, this is more important than ever. As you are aware, we have been encouraging the children to be adventurous and creative with their play for a few years and we are now in need of some new bits and pieces! If you are able to donate any of these, please do contact one of us...

Suitcases (any size and type), guttering, cable drums, plastic crates, bins or boxes (any size) noodles (the type you use in the swimming pool!), buckets (any size), nets and ropes, road signs and cones, kitchen pots, pans, baking trays, worktables, wooden spoons, chopping boards, pegs (to help to set up dens), tubes of various sizes and various materials, storage bins, sand pit toys and tools, dressing up clothes and accessories, small world toys (dinosaurs, lego, duplo, cars, etc), large cardboard tubes plastic piping tubes / PVC tubes, tarps or even large empty spools (used for wire, chain, rope).
