

Punctuality in the mornings

Over the past few weeks, we have observed an increase in the number of children arriving late to school. Punctuality is a fundamental aspect of a student's success, and we believe that fostering good habits from an early age is crucial for their academic journey.

Registration begins at 8:30 am and concludes at 8:45 am each day. We understand the challenges of busy mornings, but the impact of regularly arriving late at school on your child's education cannot be understated. Did you know that arriving just 5 minutes late every day accumulates to the equivalent of missing 3 full days of school each year?

To support you and your child in arriving on time, we would like to share some practical tips with you:

Establish a regular routine: Create a morning routine that your child can follow consistently. Predictability helps reduce stress and ensures a smoother start to the day.

Prepare the night before: Encourage your child to set out their clothes and organize their school materials before bedtime. This simple practice can save valuable time in the morning.

Set a reasonable bedtime: A proper night's sleep is essential for effective learning. Set a bedtime that allows your child to get enough rest, promoting better concentration and overall well-being.
