
## This week in Worship:

This week's worship focused on forgiveness and repentance using Zacchaeus' story in **Luke 19:1-10**. The central message emphasised not just apologising for mistakes but actively working to make amends, as demonstrated by Zacchaeus. We reflected on personal reactions to surprises, recognizing that apologies alone are insufficient, requiring tangible efforts to repair damage.

The global perspective, drawn from **Psalm 89:11**, helped us to discuss positive choices to better the world. Our week concluded with a reflection on the three-step process of acknowledging mistakes, apologising, and actively making amends. **Proverbs 17:9** highlighted the importance of forgiveness in fostering friendships. Each worship closed with quotes on forgiveness and a prayer for guidance in building a more peaceful world.

We discussed the global goals and thought about how we could contribute to these aims in making the world a better place.

#### Lunchtime Football

Following discussions with the school council, from Term 4, children will be able to play football at lunchtimes on Tuesdays and Thursday lunchtimes.

The school council have decided that, to play football at lunchtimes, children will need to sign an agreement to show they have understood the rules an expectations. These are:

- Football is for everyone. All should be made to feel welcome and invited to play.
  - In football we are supportive and encouraging to each other; including those on other teams.
  - The referee/adult in charge has the final decision, which all player will follow and respect.
  - All players will wear shin pads at all times.
  - Players will play fairly with no poor tackles or unnecessary contact.
  - At the end, all players will shake hands.
  - Games will finish before the end of lunchtime whistle to allow all players to tidy away and shake hands.

Children are invited to bring in their own shin pads on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We will also have a supply in school for children to use.

Children should NOT bring in football boots with studs or blades/.


