### PARENT GOVERNOR VOTES

Could we remind parents who wish to vote that returned slips need to be sent in as detailed below:

• Ballot papers should be returned in a sealed, inner, unmarked envelope

• The sealed, unmarked envelope should then be placed in a second, outer envelope

- The second, outer envelope should clearly be marked with:
  - 'Parent Governor Election'
- the name and address of the voter
- the name(s) of the voter's child(ren)
- the voter's signature across the seal

Failure to submit your ballot (voting) paper in this way, may result in your vote not being counted.

### Social Media and Chat Rooms

At school, we are seeing an increasing number of children facing issues with interactions and discussions via social media and chat room channels such as Tik Tok, Roblox and Whatsapp. Whilst we do not recommend children of this age group accessing these platforms, below are a number of tips to support parents in ensuring your child is safe and acts appropriately when talking with friends online.

Open Communication: Maintain open and honest communication with your child about their online activities. Encourage them to share any concerns or issues they may encounter while using social media.

Set Privacy Settings: Help your child understand the importance of privacy settings. Teach them how to adjust their privacy settings to limit who can see their posts and personal information.

Friend and Follower Management: Encourage your child to be selective in accepting friend or follower requests. Teach them to only connect with people they know and trust in real life.

Regular Monitoring: Regularly check your child's social media accounts and monitor their interactions. This can help you identify any potential risks or inappropriate behaviour.

Educate about Strangers: Teach your child about the dangers of interacting with strangers online. Emphasise the importance of not sharing personal information or meeting someone they've only met online.

Discuss Cyberbullying: Talk to your child about cyberbullying and its consequences. Encourage them to report any instances of bullying they witness or experience and assure them that you are there to support them.

Be Aware of Trends and Challenges: Stay informed about the latest social media trends and challenges that may potentially harm your child's well-being. Discuss the potential risks and encourage them to think critically before participating.

Encourage Responsible Posting: Teach your child about responsible posting and the potential impact their words and actions can have on others. Remind them to think before they post and to be respectful of others' feelings and privacy.

Monitor Time Spent Online: Set limits on the amount of time your child spends on social media platforms. Encourage them to engage in offline activities and maintain a healthy balance between their online and offline lives.

Be a Positive Role Model: Lead by example and demonstrate responsible online behaviour. Show your child how to use social media in a positive and respectful manner.

Remember, monitoring your child's social media interactions is essential, but it should be done in a supportive and non-invasive manner. Building trust and maintaining open communication will help ensure their safety and well-being in the online world.
